

Declaration on conflict materials



As an EMS provider, technosert electronic is aware of its responsibility towards the environment, safety, society, and human rights.

This motivates us to support all our customers to the best of our ability when gathering information from our suppliers in accordance with the following ordinances, guidelines, and regulations:

- RoHS (Restriction of Hazardous Substances)
- TSCA (Toxic Substances Control Act)
- REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals)
- SVHC (Substances of Very High Concern)
- Conflict materials (Dodd-Frank Act)

As a service provider, we do not directly influence the materials used by suppliers and prescribed by customers.

Furthermore, technosert electronics does not source minerals or materials from outside the EU and thus does not act as an importer. Therefore, an obligation to register also does not apply. In accordance with our mission statement and our code of conduct, we see it as our duty to ensure that our services comply with international standards and laws.

For this reason, we actively implement the following measures:

- purchase of materials from reputable manufacturers only where traceability is a prerequisite
- no purchase of materials and minerals outside the EU
- gathering information from suppliers and making this available to customers
- selection of suppliers – where we are free to do so as an EMS service provider – in accordance with the above regulations

Manufacturers of electronic components such as microcrystals, Fairchild, microchips, etc., are the only reliable sources of information regarding conflict materials or specific substances used for the manufacture of their products.
